planning for spring

Bulbs and Pansies

With spring in mind, we are now bulk ordering bulbs. In order to allow adequate planting time, and for best color and variety availability. Please order by October 1st, 2017. Planting will begin in early October. As the summer annuals fade into the fall, pansies are a great option to extend the season by supplementing your beds and pots with additional lasting color.



Nightscaping

Extend the enjoyment of your landscape by adding outdoor lighting. Highlight your architecture and enhance your plantings by having one of our specialized lighting designers provide you with a design and estimate.

Winter Watering

An often overlooked key ingredient to any good landscape; winter watering provides supplemental nutrients in dry spells. All plants (turf included) still need timely moisture through snowmelt or by supplemental hand watering.

Dormant and Rejuvenation Pruning

The dormant season (late fall to late winter) is an excellent time for shrub pruning. No leaves means less stress to the plant, the structure is visible, and produces less debris. This is a horticulturally correct method to renew or rejuvenate shrubs, especially mature specimens that have outgrown their space.

Fall & Winter Clean-ups


Take advantage of the great fall weather and the nice days we tend to have in January and February with a clean-up. Fallen leaves and loose, undesirable organic material will be removed from rock and mulch areas. Fall and winter maintenance helps to keep insects and pests away that like to take cover in the organic material.

Landscape Construction and Renovation

Sprinkler Winterization

We will start scheduling this service for the second week in October and recommend no later than November 14th (remember that your plants may still need to be hand watered if we are having a moderate winter). It is highly probable that we will experience early cold spells and even snow before some systems are winterized. Proper maintenance and care includes insulating your backflow against these temporary cold spells. For newly installed systems by Designscapes Colorado, this is a complimentary service, but must be scheduled with our maintenance department.

NOTE: Sprinkler systems are winterized with compressed air, and to the best of our knowledge, there is no water left in the lines, therefore we do not warranty any freeze damage that may occur. As a note of conservation, please remember to reduce your watering schedule by 20% during the fall season.
